Thanks to the hard work of the members of the Texas Commission on Community College Finance throughout the interim, TAB is pleased to support the full recommendations of the Texas Commission on Community College Finance.

Texas has created more jobs than any other state in the nation over the past year, have won the Governor's Cup 11 years in a row and have been named the best state for Business by CEO Magazine 18 years in a row. And that is thanks to the leadership of the state from the Legislature to the Governor's office.

If we are to maintain our standing as the best state for business, we must invest in our future workforce and address an issue that is coming down the pike. Due to the number of businesses moving to the Lone Star State, there is an increased need for skilled workers and those with some sort of postsecondary education.

Currently about 62% of jobs in Texas require some sort of postsecondary education but only 48% of Texas have a postsecondary credential and currently, only 22% of Texas students earn a postsecondary credential within 6 years of graduating high school.

House Bill 8 can help rectify this problem by investing in community colleges throughout the state and shifting how it funds these community colleges. This bill takes into account recommendations from the Texas Commission on Community College Finance which suggests shifting state funding to be majority outcomes-based. House bill 8 will also incentivize work-based learning and invest in employer partnerships to ensure we are meeting the needs of Texas' employers.

Additionally, HB 8 will increase financial aid with a goal to support at least 70% of qualified low-income college students pursuing credentials of value. TAB is proud to join with over 30 business organizations throughout the state in supporting the swift passage of House Bill 8.
